The smoke signal is one of the oldest forms of communication which people used to communicate over long distances. It involves covering a fire so that different shapes and sizes of smoke clouds rise into the air.

The North American Indians are probably the most well-known users of smoke signals, often appearing in Hollywood Western films with cowboys. Each North American Indian tribe had their own system of signals. The fire was started using damp grass but another thing that mattered was where it was lit. If the fire was halfway up a hill, it meant everything was OK, but if the fire was on the top of the hill, this meant danger was near.

Smoke signals have been used throughout history in many different countries. In ancient China, soldiers were able to inform people about an attack by smoke signals. The Great Wall of China is a huge wall which stretches the length of the country, and at certain points along the wall there are towers. By signalling from tower to tower, they could send messages as far away as 750km in just a few hours.

Some smoke signals are very simple, like those of the Australian Aborigines. They used smoke signals when they entered land which was not theirs. This was simply to inform others that they were there. A Greek historian called Polybius came up with a more complicated system of alphabetical smoke signals around 150 BC. He invented a system of converting Greek letters into numbers. Messages were signalled by holding sets of torches in pairs.

The Yahgan people who lived on the islands south of South America also used smoke signals. When a whale got stuck on a beach, they needed to tell others that there was a lot of meat there, and it shouldn't go to waste. So, they used smoke signals to inform people.

In 1963, a group of criminals stole £2.6 million from a train travelling through Buckinghamshire in England. Most of the money was never recovered and it is considered to be the largest robbery in British history.

The robbery took months to organise. The leader of the group was a man called Bruce Reynolds, but there were 16 more robbers involved. The train they robbed was a Royal Mail train travelling from Edinburgh to London. Fifteen of the robbers were at the robbery. Their plan was first to stop the train, and they managed to do so easily by covering a green traffic light and placing a red light powered by a battery in front of it. At the sight of this, the train driver, Jack Mills, stopped the train.

The robbers' plan was then for one of their people to move the train to the place where their van was and load all the money. Ronnie Biggs was the robber responsible for finding someone to drive the train. Unfortunately the man he found, Stan Agate, couldn't drive that particular kind of train. In the end, they made the original train driver drive the 800 m down the track.

The robbers had no problem getting the money from the train to the van and, amazingly, there were no police officers or security guards on board. They cut all the phone lines in the area so none of the train workers could call for help while they were escaping to an old farm 27 miles away. On the way, they were listening carefully to the radio for reports of the crime and once there, they divided the money into 17 equal amounts.

Most of the robbers were arrested within six months of the crime, and because of the size of the robbery, it was a major news story making the robbers well-known all over the country. The most famous robber is probably Ronald 'Buster' Edwards because of the 1988 film *Buster* about his life and involvement in the robbery. Another one of the train robbers who became famous was Ronnie Biggs. He was sent to prison after the robbery, but escaped and went to France. He spent 36 years on the run living in Australia and Brazil. In 2001, he returned to England and was arrested.

A stunt performer, also called stuntman or stuntwoman, is the person who does the dangerous stunts when making a film or TV programme. Stunt performers have to jump out of cars, set themselves on fire, fall out of helicopters, anything that is considered too dangerous for actors.

In the early days, cinema actors such as Buster Keaton and Charlie Chaplin did most of their own stunts. These were often very dangerous and the actors weren't as fit and strong as actors today. However, filmmakers quickly realised how dangerous this was and began using stunt performers so that nothing happened to their leading actors.

Often, it is important for the stunt performer and the actor of the scene to look alike. These are called stunt doubles and they can work with actors for decades on a variety of films. Most action film actors use stunt doubles, though some are known to do a few of their own stunts. Tom Cruise performed many stunts in Mission: Impossible films and Viggo Mortensen who played Aragorn in the Lord of the Rings films played all of his own action scenes, including fighting with a sword. He was injured a few times but luckily not too seriously.

There are some stars who are famous for being both actors and stunt performers. Jackie Chan has made over 100 films performing some incredible stunts. He is famous for making sure scenes are perfect and once it took 2900 takes to get one scene just right. Over the years Chan has had many injuries and broken most of his bones on various occasions. Other stunt performers are not as lucky. The Indian action film actor Jayan was a legend in India and was also famous for performing all of his own stunts. In 1980 he died during a stunt where he was hanging from a helicopter that crashed.

Surprisingly, stunt performing is as popular as ever with many people wanting to get into it. However, with the development of computer graphics or CGI, filmmakers can produce virtual scenes by using computers. CGI appears in almost all films nowadays and it is becoming easier to create and cheaper, meaning the demand for stunt performers is less. Many filmmakers disagree with this and believe there will always be a place for stunt performers. People will always react better when they see an actual person performing stunts.

Computer games are here to stay

There was a time when computer games were only played by adolescents. However, today they appeal to all age groups. Educational games are played by three-year-olds and there are even exercise workouts for people in their seventies and eighties. Computer games are easy to use, have excellent visual effects, and Internet users can play games with people from the other side of the globe. It is not surprising to discover that in the entertainment world, computer games are overtaking the popularity and financial success of music and films.

The work and money that go into computer games can compete with any film production. Technology has played a huge part in the success of computer games. The capabilities of games consoles are incredible, compared to just a decade ago. They are fast becoming the only entertainment device that you need in your house, as they can play DVDs, music, use TV services and even offer social networking services. In the future they might even make coffee for you!

There was a time when young people wanted to become astronauts or film stars when they grew up. But a recent survey among teenagers in the USA revealed that the most popular occupation was 'computer game designer'. The most amazing thing about computer games is that they have only been around for about 50 years. Therefore, as a means of entertainment they are still very young and how they will develop is still to be seen.

Frida Kahlo

Frida Kahlo was a Mexican painter who was born on 6th July 1907. She spent most of her life in her home known as *La Casa Azul* or the Blue House, which was in Coyoacán. At the age of six, she had Polio, a disease which made one of her legs much thinner than the other. Because of this, she wore long colourful dresses for most of her life. In 1922 she entered one of Mexico's top schools, where she was only one of 35 students.

When she was 18 years old, she was involved in an accident. She was on a bus when it crashed into a tram. She suffered terrible injuries and only just survived. She managed to recover and walk

again, but she was in pain for most of the rest of her life. Throughout her life, she had her back operated on thirty-five times. For three months after the accident, she had to stay in bed, so she started painting to pass the time. She painted many self-portraits saying 'I paint myself because I am often alone, and I am the subject that I know best.' She was influenced by the culture of the native people of Mexico, using bright colours and dramatic symbols.

Kahlo decided she wanted to be an artist, so she began communicating with the well-known Mexican artist Diego Rivera, asking him for advice. Rivera realised Kahlo was very talented and he encouraged her. They became very close and married in 1929. However, their marriage had many problems. In 1939 the French poet André Breton invited Kahlo to Paris where she had her first exhibition. The Louvre bought one of her paintings, and it was the first work of art by a twentieth century Mexican artist to be bought by the famous museum.

The Louvre painting was the only artistic success Kahlo had in her lifetime. She died in 1954 and her work was not appreciated until decades after her death. Until then, she was only remembered as Rivera's wife. In the early 1980s, the artistic style of Mexico started coming into fashion which brought Kahlo's paintings into the public eye. In 1982 Kahlo's work was exhibited for the first time outside of Mexico at a successful exhibition at the Whitechapel Gallery in London. At the same time Hayden Herrera wrote the book *Frida: A biography of Frida Kahlo*. This bestseller was turned into a film in 2002 starring Salma Hayek.
