Part 2 Individual Long Turn

- (i) Candidate A speaks for 1-2 minutes on a given topic.
- (ii) Candidate B answers a short question on the same topic.
- (ii) Candidates then swap roles.
- (3-4 minutes for each candidate)

Part 3 Discussion

- (i) Candidates discuss a topic in pairs,
- (ii) Both need to make a decision to answer a given question
- (iii) Each candidate is given a broader question on the same topic to answer.
- (4-5 minutes)

Grammar and vocabulary

You need to use varieties of structures to demonstrate your language abilities

E.g. Where would like to go on holidays in the future?

- I would like to go to Paris. It's a romantic city and I want to see it.
- If I had the opportunity, I'd like to travel to Paris because it is such a romantic city and it looks splendid. I learn that Paris is the city of love.

Discourse management

You need to build longer, coherent and fluent answers. You can do this by using conjunctions and complex linking words.

E.g. What are you going to do later?

- I'm going to visit my friends later today. We're going to a shopping centre.
- I'm going to meet my friend later today and we're going to go to a shopping centre because it might rain. On the other hand, if the weather's nice, we might to the park instead.

Fluency is an important factor in speaking. Hesitation is normal even though it should be avoided. If you are hesitated, use phrases to give yourself time to think.

Buying time to think

- That's a good question.
- Well let me think...
- Let me see...
